





The ice road for snowmobiles is now open and Temagami First Nation will continue prepping (dragging) the road in accordance with Band Policy. Snowmobilers are requested to travel the snowmobile ice road; do stay left of the pickets – access points are marked on/off at the Beach (Arnold's & Woody's) and at the on/off at the main landing.

Be advised that **Band vehicles (cars, trucks)** are **NOT** permitted to travel on the snowmobile ice road at this time. Another notice will be sent out to inform you when ploughing for a vehicle ice road will begin. Be advised those traveling off the marked ice roads are doing so at their own risk – band vehicles are not permitted to travel off the marked ice road unless directed otherwise.

TFN LAND CODE NEWS RELEASE – December 22, 2016

The Land Code Committee is pleased to announce the Temagami First Nation **LAND CODE DOCUMENT (Draft Version 3.3 December 19, 2016)** is uploaded and can be viewed online at www.temagamilandcode.com. This document is the end result of editing three drafts using community and committee input over a 2-year period. This is the *final* round of consultation of this document before the Land Code and Individual Agreement are voted on by the TFN membership later this spring. The Individual Agreement will be drafted and presented to the membership in early 2017. The date for the ratification vote can be set once the Land Code has had this final consultation round and a legal review. This is the last chance to share your input into the Land Code document. There are consultations scheduled below so come on out and let's talk Land Code and what our land management future could look like on our Reserve Lands. If you can't make it out to a meeting please feel free to contact us with any questions at

Restorative Justice—A Community Initiative

The Bear Island Policing Committee recently received funding from the Ministry of Justice (Federal) to study and implement a Restorative Justice system on Bear Island. It remains to be determined whether this system will be available to community members residing off Reserve.

The Bear Island Policing Committee, Chaired by Virginia McKenzie, is made up of the following members:

- Virginia McKenzie—Chair
- Brad Kerr— Bear Island Police Officer
- Tom Saville Jr.— Bear Island Police Officer
- John McKenzie— Retired Bear Island Police Officer and TFN Elder
- Joe Katt— TFN Elder and Second Chief, TFN
- Jamie Friday— Community member

All Policing Committee members are on the Restorative Justice Committee, as well as:

- Tyler Paul, TFN Youth Worker
- Nancy Shipman, Community member
- John Turner, Community member

The Restorative Justice Committee has held 2 information and discussion sessions so far; the first was held on December 14th, for TFN service provider staff. The second was held on January 5th, for TFN youth. Both sessions were successful and well attended.

Virginia McKenzie contributed this statement:

Happy New Year.

I sincerely hope that the Holiday season brought many blessing to you all.

Over the next few months the Bear Island Police Committee will be engaging in the development of our Restorative Justice Program.

We will be having many upcoming sessions to gather historical information to develop our framework. Community participation is one of the key elements of our success.

The Police Committee created a team to spearhead this process. Many thanks to Jamie Friday ; she has been inspirational to us with her commitment and organizational skills.

Many thanks also to Nancy Shipman, Tyler Paul, and Tashina Paul, who brought the youth together for our meeting Friday January 5th. It was well attended.

We have an upcoming Pasta Dinner with information regarding the implementation of insurance and other safety factors.

We have a social responsibility to keep our children safe.

OVERVIEW

Restorative Justice is a system of Criminal Justice that focuses on Rehabilitation and Reconciliation between the victim & offender, offender & community, and victim & community. Healing for all is the ultimate goal.

Types of Restorative Justice include; Victim – Offender Mediation, Family Group Conferencing (Intervention Method), and Healing Circles.

THE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Process Goals include the following:

- Victims who agree to be involved in the process can do so safely and come out of it satisfied
- Offenders understand how their action has affected the victim and other people, assume responsibility for the consequences of their action, and commit to making reparation
- Flexible measures are agreed upon by the parties which emphasize repairing the harm done and, wherever possible, also address the reasons for the offence
- Offenders live up to their commitment to repair the harm done and attempt to address the factors that led to their behaviour
- The victim and the offender both understand the dynamic that led to the specific incident, gain a sense of closure and are reintegrated into the community.

Restorative Justice Objectives:

- Restore community order and peace and repair damaged relationships;
- Denounce criminal behaviour as unacceptable and reaffirm community values;
- Support victims, give them a voice, enable their participation and address their needs;
- Encourage all concerned parties to take responsibility, particularly the offenders;
- Identify restorative, forward- looking outcomes;
- Prevent recidivism by encouraging change in individual offenders and facilitating their reintegration into the community.

THE OPPORTUNITY

- Involving all that have a voice and an opinion / ideas
- Peer to peer treatment because authority figure to offender doesn't work for everyone
- Assisting in our peers' healing and rehabilitation

WHY RESTORATIVE JUSTICE WORKS FOR FIRST NATION PEOPLE

The term "restorative" refers to something that is broken and needs to be restored back to its original state.

For First Nations people, we have been assimilated into western culture with few avenues left to revert back to our original states- "the traditional ways of healing, working and playing." Instead we are born into and are growing up in a society full of foreign identities. We are adapting to and taking on identities of the popular culture because we haven't been taught our own true identity as First Nations people.]



Random News, Accomplishments, and Good Stuff from the Community




Jayda Moore is only 6 years old, but she's already a dedicated and disciplined dancer.




Demi Mathias

TFN member, Nurse Practitioner, and tireless advocate for First Nations Health **Mae Katt** is in making news again. **Thunderbird Partnership's** Winter Newsletter reports on the success of the Suboxone Mobile Treatment Team, which Mae was instrumental in creating and still works with.

Here's a quote:

"Some communities that have been using the in-community treatment model for 4 years have seen incredible change. People are employed, children are coming back from child welfare, people are fishing, on the land, and building houses."

The report cites remarkable statistics as well:

- Police criminal charges are down 61.1%
- Child protection cases are down 58.3%
- School attendance has risen by 33.3%


Mommy Jolene Polson says:



Sage had a bit of an uphill struggle at first, after being born prematurely. Clearly though, she's doing great!


